### FOR THE YEAR ENDED 31 MARCH 2014

The directors present their report and accounts for the year ended 31 March 2014.

The accounts have been prepared in accordance with the accounting policies set out in note 1 to the accounts and comply with the company's governing document, the Companies Act 2006 and the Statement of Recommended Practice, "Accounting and Reporting by Charities", issued in March 2005.

### Structure, governance and management

The company is constituted as a company limited by guarantee and is governed in accordance with its Memorandum and Articles of Association.

The company is run by a group of directors and members of the organisation who meet on a regular basis throughout the year.

All directors undertake appropriate charity compliance training and are aware of their obligations and responsibilities in that regard.

The directors have assessed the major risks to which the company is exposed, and are satisfied that systems are in place to mitigate exposure to the major risks.

### Objectives and activities

The main activity of the company is to award grants to the Fort Augustus & Glenmoriston community, either to organisations or individuals in the furtherance of the charitable objectives.

### Achievements and performance

The directors have worked hard in delivering the apprenticeship scheme as well as the community caretaker that we reported for the future last year.

We have started the apprenticeship scheme and have invited Glengarry Trust and Stratherick & Foyers Community Trust to join in with us. This will allow up to 4 young people to start an apprenticeship yearly. Local businesses in the three areas have priority over businesses from outwith the area. We awarded three apprenticeships in the financial year two from Fort Augustus and one from Invergarry. They are two chefs and a butcher. We are looking forward to helping more young people in the upcoming year.

FOR THE YEAR ENDED 31 MARCH 2014

The Community Caretaker was started in July and the transfer of employee from the Highland Council happened in October under TUPE when the service level agreement came into place for the Highland Council Community Challenge Fund which we were awarded. It has been a learning curve for us all but we do hope that you see a difference in the village and as the years go on it will get better still as we get areas improved. One of the largest differences has been the cemeteries and the flower beds. We need to acknowledge the kind gift from the Vernon's in providing the community with all the grass cutting machinery we needed to carry out this work.

We have supported 26 individual students with £5,200 of Travel Bursaries. The grants to groups in this financial year amount to £21,250 with us supporting both the young and the elderly through the following groups, Fort Augustus Senior Citizens and Glenmoriston Senior Citizens; lunch clubs both in Fort Augustus & Glenmoriston. Kilchuimen Primary for transport to allow the whole school to get swimming lessons which we all feel is important when we live so close to so much water via the canal & lochs. We also supported the brownies & Guides. Care Lochaber refunded £1,397.37 left over from when they tried a pilot car scheme a few years ago and we pledged this money to the transport work that has been taking place to see if we can find a solution in helping the elderly and disabled to get out and about.

#### Financial review

As the company is spreading its wings in different areas we require more expert help in ensuring our accounts comply with OSCR so we have our book keeping with Johnston Carmichael as well as our financial accounts. This now includes payroll as we now have employees.

Last year's annual investment of £50k for future funds was invested in Shaw brook bank just after the year end which is a slightly lower risk than we have invested in before but it also has the security that the capital will be easily accessed if we decide to purchase the land. We sought professional financial advice prior to making the investment. In addition, the directors have reclassified £50,000 from bank and cash to investments. The shares we held in the Beinneun wind farm were sold as we had made 150% return on them due to them getting planning permission. We had originally invested £13,300 and we received £6,650 profit when sold for £19,950. We may invest in the co-operative at a later date once the wind farm is built.

It is the policy of the charity that unrestricted funds should be maintained at a level that will ensure that, in the event of a significant drop in funding, they will be able to continue the charity's current activities while consideration is given to ways in which additional funds may be raised. This level of reserves has been maintained throughout the year.

### Plans for the future

Last year we advised that we would be looking at three areas, two we have instigated and are working on -the community caretaker, whom we have managed to secure a grant for a young person for 18 months work experience which we hope will be beneficial to the young man and this allows us to achieve more. The apprenticeships were going well so we decided to apply for further funding from SSE Regional fund and were delighted to be awarded £87,250 over two years to help with the cost of apprentices over 19.

This leaves the third item and this was looking at purchasing land, we got the authority from the members at the AGM last year and we had £9,300 from the lottery to work up the idea. This is still in progress and we carried out a full community survey in early summer to get the communities view as this is more than a member's decision. The results will be in by the AGM with some ideas and we will take this forward in the upcoming year. We have met with the agents for the land and currently they are not in a hurry to sell due to land values. We will however pursue this through the Scottish Governments right to buy scheme for communities although this does not mean they require to sell.

### FOR THE YEAR ENDED 31 MARCH 2014

### 1 Accounting policies

### 1.1 Basis of preparation

The accounts have been prepared under the historical cost convention then modified to include the investments at market value.

The financial statements have been prepared in accrodance with the Financial Reporting Standard for Smaller Entities (effective April 2008), the statement of Recommended Practice 'Accounting and Reporting by Charities' issued in March 2005 and the Companies Act 2006.

### 1.2 Incoming resources

All incoming resources are included in the statement of financial activities when the charity is legally entitled to the income and the amount can be quantified with reasonable accuracy. The following specific policies are applied to particular categories of income:-

Voluntary income is received by way of grants, donations and gifts and is included in full in the statement of financial activities when receivable. Grants, where entitlement is not conditional on the delivery of a specific performance by the charity, are recognised when the charity becomes unconditionally entitled to the grant.

Donated services and facilities are included at the value to the charity where this can be quantified. The value of services provided by volunteers has not been included.

Income from investments is included in the year in which it is receivable.

### 1.3 Resources expended

Expenditure is recognised on an accruals basis as a liability is incurred. Expenditure includes any VAT which cannot be fully recovered, and is reported as part of the expenditure to which it relates.

Costs of generating funds comprise the costs associated with attracting voluntary income and the costs of trading for fundraising purposes.

Charitable expenditure comprises those costs incurred by the charity in the delivery of its activities and services for its beneficiaries. It includes both costs that can be allocated directly to such activities and those costs of an indirect nature necessary to support them.

### 1.4 Tangible fixed assets and depreciation

Tangible fixed assets other than freehold land are stated at cost less depreciation. Depreciation is provided at rates calculated to write off the cost less estimated residual value of each asset over its expected useful life, as follows:

### 1.6 Fund accounting

Unrestricted funds are funds which are available for use at the discretion of the trustees in furtherance of the general objectives of the charity and which have not been designated for other purposes.

Designated funds comprise funds which have been set aside by the directors for particular purposes.

Restricted funds are funds which are to be used in accordance with specific restrictions imposed by donors or which have been raised by the charity for particular purposes. The cost of raising and administering such funds are charged against the specific fund. The aim and use of each restricted fund is set out in the notes to the financial statements.
